2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COOPERATION PROGRAMME (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013 AND ARTICLE 14(3)(A) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1299/2013)

Key information on the implementation of the cooperation programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.

The Interreg V-A Romania-Hungary Programme was approved by the European Commission at the end of 2015, on 9th of December.

Immediately after the approval by the European Commission, the Managing Authority has started all necessary actions in view of running the implementation of the Programme.

Calendar:

The time table regarding the steps for implementation of the programme was defined, indicating deadlines for all phases.

Monitoring Committee:

The general (both legal and administrative) framework for setting up the Monitoring Committee was established. Also, the Rules of Procedure for the Monitoring Committee of Interreg V-A Romania-Hungary Programme were drafted.

Documents relevant for implementation of the Programme:

The elaboration of strategic or significant documents has also started: Memorandum of Implementation—Arrangements between Member States participating in the Interreg V-A Romania-Hungary Programme, templates of contracts, Delegated tasks / Implementation Agreements.

Designation:

In view of the designation process, it was initiated the Description of the Management System, including all necessary procedures.

Institutional set-up:

Regarding the structures of the Programme, the procedures (including methodology) for selection of staff for the Joint Secretariat and Info Points were elaborated and approved during 2015. A first round of recruitments – for the Joint Secretariat – was organised.

Communication:

By defining all elements of the visual identity of the Programme, the Visual Identity Manual of Interreg V-A Romania-Hungary was prepared. Also, the elaboration of the Communication Strategy started.

Guides for Applicants:

The elaboration of Guides for Applicants (for Flagship Projects and Open Projects) also started. Guides for Applicants envisages the complete allocation which is available for operations.

Electronic Monitoring System:

Having in view that, according to Art. 122 (3) of Regulation (EU) 1303/2013, the use of an electronic data exchange system is compulsory, the Managing Authority decided to use the system designed by Interact, particularly the e-MS (Electronic Monitoring System). The contract with the City of Vienna was signed on 7th of September 2015, and (immediately after the approval of the Programme) configuration of the system has started. Also, simulation of introducing data into the system has started in the same period.
