<b>Summary</b>	<p>The project envisages the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- creating an ecological corridor connecting the two parts of the pasture Sălacea and developing a public lighting system easy pollutant from the village Hortobágy</li> <li>- creating a new infrastructure for visitors, with improved accessibility, focused on natural values and Nirului and Ierului Plains – Ierului Valley on the Romanian side and Hortobágy river and its surroundings on Hungarian side</li> <li>- developing and promoting new tourist destinations representing a new thematic route cross-linking project affected areas and newly created facilities</li> </ul> <p>The project main results are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Salacea Pasture (part of ROSPA0016 and ROSCI0021) with improved conservation status</li> <li>- natural areas of Hortobágy with improved conservation status, due to decreasing pollution</li> <li>- a new visitor infrastructure in Salacea promoting the natural values of Ierului Field and Nirului Field – Ierului Valley</li> <li>- a new visitor infrastructure focusing on the natural values of Hortobágy River</li> <li>- a new cross-border thematic route connecting two bridges, addressed to families with children and also to young couples in search of adventure in nature</li> </ul>
