Summary	<p>The following activities are foreseen to be implemented within the project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - extending and improving existing facilities - the new building of the hospital in Hódmezővásárhely will be extended with two extra floors housing the Internal Medicine Department and Pediatrics - a new Medical Prevention Centre will be created by refurbishing an old building in Satu Mare - improving the diagnostic and therapeutic background - developing and testing efficient screening and prevention programs <p>Main expected results of the project are the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - various screening programs will be run in both locations (but also with well-equipped screening buses and with the involvement of local GPs and other institutions in rural areas) to enlarge the proportion of the population that has been screened - as a new innovative element, screening will be extended to younger generations (i.e. premature babies) in cooperation with local hospitals - in general, institutions and regional/local authorities will be able to design and implement screening and prevention programs not only in the border area, but in both countries

Summary	<p>The following activities are foreseen to be implemented within the project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - building two emergency medical centers in the mountain area, Padiș and Stâna de Vale (LB) - reconstructing a building and establishing a modern physical medicine and rehabilitation center (PP2) - establishing an open telemedicine system and equipping SCJUO with modern digital radiography and echography devices and an Angio CT for chemoembolization; furthermore, equipping Spitalul Municipal with a Spect CT for oncological and endocrine diagnosis and a modern searching equipment to localize emergencies in the shortest time possible (PP3) - equipping the local hospitals with modern digital radiography and echography devices and interconnect the hospitals to the ones in Oradea (PP4, PP5, PP6, PP7) - reconstructing one building (N. Jiga no. 29, Oradea) and establishing a Learning Centre for Continuing Medical Education (PP8) <p>Main expected results of the project are the following:</p>

Summary	<p>The following activities are foreseen to be implemented within the project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - construction of 12.144 km of new roads in Arad County - modernization of 20.06 km of roads in Arad County - preparation of 43 studies in Békés County <p>Main expected results of the project are the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - direct connection of the tertiary node Curtici town to the national road DN79 (part of the comprehensive TEN-T network) on the Romanian side - preparation of studies for the improvement of roads connecting 20 settlements (tertiary nodes to the TEN-T infrastructure) on the Hungarian side <p>The selected roads will improve mobility for passengers and freight, connecting the localities to the TEN-T infrastructure while tackling the challenges of an increased traffic in the area.</p>
