Summary	 The PPs wish to address the following challenges in the eligible area: reduced health care spending in the eligible area obsolete medical equipment, old buildings lack of interconnected emergency response service health care migration from Romania to Hungary because of inequality in the quality of medical services The project's main activities are: building and equipping a new obstetrics-gynaecology clinic in Timisoara, reconstructing and endowing with professional equipment the two health departments in Szeged harmonization and improvement of cross-border medical staff capacity through exchange of experience/know-how and joint trainings elaboration of common medical protocols providing transparent information and involving a wider range of population Main expected results of the project are the following: improved infrastructure and better medical expertise; improved health care services in the field of obstetrics-gynaecology and neonatology in the cross-border area.
