Summary	The ROHU-72 project aims to increase the capacity for cross-border intervention in commonly identified risk situations, to strengthen institutional capacity and to increase the skills of citizens and intervention staff, professional and voluntary, in addressing types of emergencies. The main activities are:
	 Acquisition of specific operating and intervention equipment: LB - 1 operational vehicle,







Main results	 Timișoara for 5 days) Organizing 3 teacher training in Csongrád-Csanád (1), Arad (1), and Timis (1) counties in order to present and demonstrate the curricula for teachers who will organize special courses in schools in the field of risk prevention and emergency situations Organizing raising awareness days for citizens related to optimum behavior in case of emergency situations – 15 days Elaborating the Risk Management Strategy based on the analyses carried out and the conclusions drawn in the 6 organized workshops 2-day long seminar and practice organized in Mórahalom for fire brigades from the 3 counties. The aim of the seminar and practice is to exchange knowledge about fire brigades operations in Romania and Hungary, also analysing the legal and financial background Organizing a 2-day study-tour in Romania (1 day in Arad County, 1 day in Timis County) in order to investigate and test the new equipment The Programme Output Indicator is 5/b 1 "Population safeguarded by improved emergency response services" Through ROHU-72, a number of 770,906 citizens from the 3 partner counties benefit from increased life safeguard. The project main results are:
	 PP2 - 3 emergency care ambulance, 1 firefighting vehicle with water and foam, 19 intensive care beds, 50 injectomats, 35 infusomats, 2 transport ventilators, monitors for vital functions, 3 central monitoring station, 5 transport monitors, 2 stretchers for transport of patients, 5 portable pulse oximeters, 2 defibrillator, one difficult intubation and secretion aspirator set, portable ECG machine, 25 perfusion stands, 2 medicine cabinets PP3 - 3 complex intervention vehicles PP5 - 1 piece of universal car with additional devices Developing a common curriculum for pupils for 3 different age groups (6-10, 10-14, 14-18) having as theme the behavior in different types of emergency situations Organizing camps and joint competitions on emergencies Organizing joint training for specialized and volunteer staff (Training 1 - railway and road accidents intervention in Timișoara for 5 days and Training 2 - intervention management in Timișoara for 5 days)







- the increased capacity for risk prevention and disaster management by purchasing intervention vehicles that will complement and upgrade the existing fleet,
- the educational activities, intended for volunteers, students and teachers, resulting in increased awareness and training in case of emergency of the population,
- the risk management strategy developed by the project participants and the common protocols that allow the three counties involved to address more effectively the predictions, occurrence and consequences of disasters.
