Summary	Project ROHU-289 aims at cross-border cooperation between the 2 localities by organizing cultural events, in order to preserve and promote common traditions and to support culture as an engine of sustainable social and economic development. The main activities of the project are: • organizing a 3 days cross-border bandcrafts camp for 40
	 organizing a 3 days cross-border handcrafts camp for 40 participants in Körösszegapáti, Organizing a joint cross-border handcrafts exhibition Organizing the Kun László Festival in Kőrösszegapáti (including an exhibition, a choir, a football match, folk dances) A 3 days ecumenical choir festival, organized in Kőrösszegapáti with a joint performances







	 Organizing a 4 days folk dance camp in Vadul Crișului commune (RO); Organizing the festival called "Vama Sării", in Vadul Crișului commune (RO) (including an exhibition, a choir, a football match, folk dances) Organizing a 4 days cross border football training camp for athletes from the two localities.
	The Programme Output Indicator is "11/b2 Number of people directely involved in cross-border cooperation initiatives". Project ROHU – 289 contributes to this indicator by reaching a number of 130 people from Romania and Hungary, participants in the cross border cultural activities.
	The project creates the opportunity for the inhabitants of the 2 communes to discover unique aspects of the cultural heritage of the communities they come from and help them gain a greater appreciation for their own culture.
Main results	The project's main results are: - 130 participants in cross-border cultural activities, - 3 organized camps (crafts, folk dances and folk) - 3 organized festivals, (Kun László in Kőrösszegapáti, "Salt Customs" in Vadul Crișului and one for ecumenical choirs)
