Summary	The project ROHU-161 aimed to intensify cooperation between cross-border communities, from Arad and Csongrád-Csanád counties, and promote a healthy lifestyle through sport. The main activities implemented within the project: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organizing activities to collect data (800 digitally recorded research documents such as interviews, pictures, and films), systematize and prepare them for decision and processing on the portal.

- Organizing a seminar for the process of researching results and for choosing the development areas (40 values in 8 selected zones (5 RO+3 HU)),
- Organizing a 4 module online training/webinar to educate and inform the target group about the newly developed orienteering areas and to involve rural regions in digital development in both countries
- Develop a portal to promote the 8 selected areas and sports tourism in the border area
- Organizing an orienteering map correction training for 14 people (7 from RO and 7 from HU)
- Making map corrections in 5 selected Romanian and 3 Hungarian regions, with teachers acting as proofreaders and mentors. 13 maps were produced in the 8 locations, with the involvement of students participating in the workshops. As a result, 38.58 square km of mapped areas were corrected.
- Organizing promotional orienteering events in 5 Romanian and 3 Hungarian settlements in the programme area using the created maps and purchased devices, with 208 participants
- Organizing a closing workshop day to summarize the activities, talk about the tasks related to the final report and discuss future options,
- Purchasing equipment for carrying on the activities (6 notebooks, 1 monitor, 2 mobile phones, 6 SD cards, 1GPS, 1 Expedition-54 direction-finder, 1 Forestry laser rangefinder, 25 pieces of SIAC, 2 Alutent tents, 1 SI set, 1 Kramer software: OE2010 Standard Large)
